

EARLY LEARNING

Our weekly parent-child classes for children ages 0-3 provide a warm and welcoming introduction to PREP. Parents value the opportunity to meet and share with other families who are also starting their journey of parenting a child with Down syndrome. Parents build a network of support as they learn through class time, workshops, and individual therapy consults. Children enjoy the structured play based activities designed to introduce skills, which will help and support them in their transition to ECS and preschool.

EARLY CHILDHOOD SERVICES

As an approved ECS operator, PREP is dedicated to supporting each child's journey in an inclusive educational environment. During the first year, the program emphasizes building foundational classroom skills and introducing preschool concepts. In the second year, the focus shifts to fostering independence and encouraging social interactions with peers. PREP delivers outstanding programming through our compassionate and skilled multidisciplinary team, which includes a Speech-Language Pathologist, Occupational Therapist, Physiotherapist, and Child Development Facilitators.

- ECS had one of our largest years of enrollment with 19 students attending.

- ECS provided "open house" days for parents to join in on learning in the classrooms

PROGRAMS - MIDDLE YEARS

PREP's Middle Years Program now offers specialized programming for students in Kindergarten to Grade 2 and Grades 3 to 6. These programs focus on developing executive functioning, social skills, language, and behavior in an engaging, supportive environment. With guidance from a multidisciplinary team, including an instructor, speech-language pathologist, occupational therapist, and childhood development facilitators, students build essential skills and social connections that enhance their inclusion in community classrooms.

PROGRAMS - TEEN YEARS

Our Teen Years Program, now tailored for Jr. High and Sr. High students, emphasizes independence, self-advocacy, and social development. Teens participate in 15 sessions each year, working with a collaborative team to strengthen their executive functioning and communication abilities.

Through Teens on the Go, our teens also practice these skills in real-world settings, gaining confidence and fostering meaningful relationships with peers—all with the support of PREP's dedicated staff and volunteers.

READING PROGRAM

Learning to read is an essential life skill, which is why PREP offers an individualized and personalized reading program designed specifically for students with Down syndrome in grades K-12. Our highly skilled reading team modifies each lesson based on the interests of each student and coordinates goals with families and teaching teams. Parents also learn literacy strategies and work on reading goals at home using the resources and materials our instructors have prepared for each student.

THERAPEUTIC SERVICES

PREP's Therapeutic Services provide personalized support for children and teens with Down syndrome, focusing on communication, independence, and life skills. Speech-Language Pathologists target speech clarity, vocabulary, and social interaction, while Occupational Therapists enhance self-care, school readiness, and recreational abilities. PREP's Physiotherapist improves strength, coordination, and movement skills and our Behaviour Therapist supports functional communication, engagement, cooperation, task


persistence, and emotional regulation. Together, these services empower students to thrive at



- PREP introduced a new position of therapeutic lead in 2023 / 2024 to support all therapies at PREP
- The PREP SLPs have made meaningful connections with Providence's Expanding Capacity and Learner Supports (ECLS) program and Calgary's network for Complex Communication Needs. This has allowed our students to access support for Alternative and Augmentative Communication (AAC) across multiple environments
- PREP's OT team completed 11 applications successfully for incontinence supplies through the AADL program during the 2023-2024 school year
- PREP's Physiotherapist supported a number of families with education on AADL funding process for custom orthotics, recommendations for adjustments/ fitting, and monitoring of proper wear
- PREP's Physiotherapist collaborated with the vendor Maximum Health and Mobility for pediatric mobility equipment reviews for 2 children

FSCD

PREP partners with the Family Support for Children with Disabilities (FSCD) program to provide specialized services for children with Down syndrome and their families. Our multidisciplinary team works with families to develop personalized plans that focus on communication, behavior, social skills, and independence. Through a goal-oriented approach, we empower families with the resources and strategies they need to support their child's growth at home, school, and in the community.

FAMILY SUPPORT

Family Support services are available to any Family in the Calgary and outlying region looking for the knowledge, skills, and resources required to best support their child with Down syndrome from birth to 18 yrs of age. Liaisons are also available to provide support and clarity as parents navigate complex systems. Workshops and webinars are offered to families who want to learn more about specific topics related to their child's journey and to learn from other families. Families have access to individual consults, home visits, mentoring, transition planning and much more.

Meet Siobhan: Championing Inclusion in Sports, Community, and Employment

In February 2024, Calgary hosted the Special Olympics Canada Winter Games, with Siobhan as one of five Special Olympic athletes selected as Athlete Ambassadors. Her preparation at PREP helped her secure this paid role, where she advocated for inclusive employment and the importance of sports.

Over ten months, Siobhan spoke at events, participated in the Calgary Stampede Parade, and cheered on athletes during the Games. Her work as an Ambassador showcased the capabilities of individuals with disabilities.

Today, Siobhan balances two part-time jobs, competes in Special Olympics sports, and pursues her love for theatre. She remains an inspiration to everyone who knows her.

EDUCATION SUPPORT

PREP offers supports to educators and families through our Education Support services to ensure everyone has the knowledge, resources, and capacity to create successful learning environments for students with Down syndrome. With the right supports in place, we believe that every individual with Down syndrome is able to thrive throughout their education careers. Our Education Support Coordinator works directly with families and teaching teams through consultations, workshops, professional development, webinars, and resource development.

- Delivered three Introduction to Down Syndrome webinars, fostering new relationships and strengthening connections with schools in the Calgary Catholic School District, Calgary Board of Education, and across the province
- Provided program support to over 20 schools across Alberta, including developing program plans, creating meaningful social opportunities, and implementing strategies to enhance student success
- Expanded our collaboration with the Yellowknife Catholic School Board by offering in-person consultations to support students and educators

CAMPS

PREP's Specialized Camps provide children and teens with Down syndrome the opportunity to build skills, foster friendships, and explore their independence in a fun and supportive environment. Tailored to meet the unique needs of each age group, our camps offer a mix of structured learning and engaging activities. This year, we extended our Grade 3–6 summer camps to full days, a change that was warmly welcomed by families. Our Teen Camps included exciting outings to places like the Calgary Zoo, SAIT, Stadium Nissan, and Lil' E Café, where participants practiced navigating Calgary Transit and developed valuable life skills. These camps are an important extension of PREP's mission, giving students hands-on opportunities to grow socially, academically, and personally while having a blast!
